



CAT CHECKLIST

It is of the upmost importance to register your pet with a vet and take them for regular health assessments. Always consider pet insurance as vet bills can add up and are usually unexpected. We highly recommend microchipping cats. Discuss the benefits of neutering your cat, especially if you have no intention of breeding from them.

Most pet cats in the UK are 'moggies' which means they are not a specific breed. Pedigree breeds have more predictable personalities but overall cat's requirements are the same, no matter which breed. Cats are considered solitary animals which means they don't always appreciate another cat in 'their' house or territory. Always speak to your vet if you are thinking of getting more than one.
